COMPOSITE INJECTION TECHNIQUE (F.I.T.)

INTRODUCTION

F.I.T.: A predictable and aesthetic outcome!

While more costly porcelain restorations remain the mainstay in this treatment modality, composite restorations have always been an economical alternative. Using the injection moulding technique, composite restorations are created by injecting the composite into a silicone key that is directly positioned into the patient's mouth.

Extensive treatment planning and smile design can be time-consuming. However, this time is often saved at the actual execution of the treatment plan. The difficulty lies in accurately transferring the exact prototype tooth form and shape into the final delivery, and this skill can take years to master.

Using the composite F.I.T. solution from **SCD**, the aesthetic outcome is more predictable and the total procedure is less stressful. As part of the treatment, the diagnostic step can be completed outside the mouth, in the absence of the patient. The main advantage of this technique is that restorations are first designed using the **SCD** View diagnostic tool and then copied and transferred in detail to the natural teeth. For complex morphologies, challenging aesthetic cases or cases requiring reestablishment of the occlusal vertical dimension, a predictable result can be obtained and chair time reduced with this relatively simple procedure. Adjustments can also be made afterwards if required.

Because these restorative treatments usually span an extensive area, the composite used should be strong, wear resistant and also offer the desired aesthetic properties. That's why **SCD** use G-ænial Universal Injectable - It is an ideal product for this indication thanks to its great thixotropy and excellent mechanical and aesthetic properties.




IOS scans with Medit scanner upper jaw and lower jaw and bite scan








Virtual mock-up SCD View
